

The American Guild of Organists has declared Sunday March 5 as "Woman Composer Sunday". Organists around the country are amplifying women composers in their musical selections this morning in an effort to close the gender equity gap and celebrate a spirit of inclusivity. The composer of this morning's prelude, Florence Price (1887-1953), was a Black American from Little Rock, Arkansas. She attended the prestigious New England Conservatory and is noted as the first African American woman to have her work performed by a major orchestra. Her 1 st and 3rd Symphonies were recently revived and recorded by The Philadelphia Orchestra, and the album won a Grammy in 2022. The composer of today's postlude, Emma Louise Ashford (1850-1930), was an organist and composer born in Newark, Delaware. She was an editor for Lorenz Publishing Company and composed extensively for The Organist, a periodical for church musicians that is still published today.
